

Our Scouting Location & History

Cub Scout Pack 455 has served the Eagan, Inver Grove Heights and Rosemount areas since 1998. We are ranked as a “Platinum Unit” by the Boy Scouts of America. We have a strong and supportive chartering partner, Emanuel Lutheran Church. Our meeting place for pack meetings is Red Pine Elementary School, 530 Red Pine Lane, just east of Highway 3. We are part of the Gold ranked Chief Black Dog District, one of 25 Districts in the Northern Star Council. This Council is one of the five largest of the over 275 Councils in the nation, and provides numerous opportunities to boys and their families year round.

Family Inclusive Scouting

Pack 455 is one of the first packs in the council to pilot and implement family inclusive scouting. This scouting model allows siblings of all ages and genders to participate in den activities, pack meetings and camping; allowing families to enjoy scouting together.

Time Commitment to Cub Scouts

You can expect 2 to 3 meetings a month; 1 Pack meeting and 1 to 2 den meetings. We offer 3 pack camps, many service opportunities and fun summer events that you can pick and choose from. We also encourage you to attend parent meetings, which allows parents to have an active say in the programming and direction of the pack.

Cub Scouting Basics

Cub Scouting is organized into dens beginning with Lions in Kindergarten, then Tigers in First Grade, Wolves in Second Grade, Bears in Third Grade, Webelos in Fourth Grade and Arrows of Light in Fifth Grade. Besides a uniform to help their young minds feel a sense of belonging and pride, all our leaders seek to provide the foundation for character development, good citizenship, sportsmanship, family values and spiritual enrichment.



Cub Scout Program

Every boy deserves a trained leader, and Pack 455 is committed to this goal. We also make sure that Scouting is Safe and Fun for everyone! In an effort to ensure this, besides games, skits, and educational activities at our Den and Pack meetings, we also provide several special events throughout the year, including weekend camps, Pinewood Derby; Blue & Gold Banquet; Parade Participation and Community Service opportunities.

Costs of Scouting

Pack 455 has made a commitment to supplement Scouting fees in order to make our activities affordable for all.

Dues: The adult guardian is asked to pay a \$46 chartering fee to start which covers your class-B t-shirt, patches and neckerchief. Then Annual dues of \$125 which covers the cost of the badges, belt loops, and pins used in the boys’ advancement, as well as fees incurred to provide the quality program we offer.

Fundraising: Our main fundraiser is the fall Popcorn and Wreath sale, in which the Cub Scout is eligible to earn 30% of all his sales to offset annual dues and camp costs as well as receive great prizes. A spring fundraiser is available later in the year.

Camping and Activities: Our pack organizes three Pack Camps a year; a fall, Polar Cubs in the winter and a spring camp. Camping fees strive to be economical and cover food and activities. Cabins are available at all campouts.

Uniforms: We have a limited supply of “Experienced” boy uniforms and corresponding insignia can be purchased cheaply through our own supply.

Payment assistance and scholarships are available.
