

Your Return on Investment

Annual dues cover the cost of awards or badges, pack events, liability insurance, and facilities. Dues are about a hundred dollars per scout per year. The pack sponsors fundraisers each year where boys can raise funds to offset dues and activity costs.

Activities, ranging from movie and miniature golf to professional sporting events, can cost anywhere from free to thirty dollars per person, and are optional. The Pack takes advantage of group rates and Scouting discounts. On average our scout families spend twenty dollars a quarter for special activities.

Pack camps strive to be economical with an average fee of \$20 per person covering two nights of camping with activities and meals included. Target shooting, model rockets, leather working, survival training, and bat house building are just a few of the many activities camp fees have covered.

Parents and guardians are critical to Cub Scouts. They attend a pack and a den meeting with the scout each month as well as join them on outings. We each do a share to make this program a huge success!

Scholarships are available and kept confidential.
