DUTIES

NOTE: Should not need to water any trees. There are a couple of young new trees, but we will leave it to the garden club to keep an eye on them.

FRONT PLANTERS DAILY WATERING

Use the 50' hose to thoroughly saturate pots & baskets.

GARDENS AS NEEDED WATERING

Rossini Gardens: Use the 50' hose with sprinkler kept in front.

Butterfly Garden: Use a 100' hose with sprinkler kept in SE doorway.

Corrigan Memorial Garden: Use 100' hose with sprinkler kept in NE doorway and 200' hose with sprinkler kept in north doorway.

North Terrace Garden: Use 200' hose with sprinkler.

FRONT SIGN GARDEN: Attach the 100' hose in front to the 200' hose.

WHEN DONE, RETURN HOSES and EQUIPMENT, MAKE SURE ALL FAUCETS ARE LOCKED, AND WATER KEYS ARE STOWED.

LITTER PATROL: Pick up any litter on school property including the baseball diamonds and playground. Bring your own trash bag and dispose of litter off-site. Try to do once during your schedule time.

4 July - 17 July - Wolf Dens

18 July - 30 July - Bear Dens

31 July - 13 August - Junior Webelos Patrols

14 August - 27 August - Senior Webelos Patrols
